I am delighted to advise NASHS school community that planning for the new building program has commenced! We have met on several occasions with the Department of Education and the architects, H & H Architects, and determined that the new two story block will be built adjacent to, and on the northern side of the current Year 7 block. The current Year 7 block (or M block as it is commonly known) will undergo refurbishment for use by the Albany Secondary Education Support Centre.

The new block will be mainly used by year 7 students. Two new Science laboratories will also be built next to the existing science block taking the number of science labs from four to six. The whole New Build is expected to be completed by mid-2020.

While this is all very exciting, it does mean that unfortunately our plans to bituminize the John St end of the gravel car park will need to be put on hold until after the completion of the New Build. Bituminizing the Anson Rd end of the gravel car park will go ahead with an expected completion date of February 2019. This will provide an extra forty much need car parking bays.

While on building projects, we will also be making some modifications to the front office area in the near future with a more sheltered main entrance and a parent and visitors waiting area in reception.

Our school library and information centre continues to modernize in many ways. We recently installed some café style seating booths that have proven to be very popular with our students.

While we have maintained our book collection, increasingly students are using digital data bases for research. Education is of course no longer bound by the four walls of a classroom and so NASHS is purchasing a range of data bases so that students can access them on-line out of school hours 24/7. Personally I have been so proud to have recently received such complimentary feedback from the school community about the exemplary behaviour of our students in a number of different forums. I am looking forward to sharing some of the achievements of our school at the School Board meeting this week. The Board oversees the school budget and performance of the school. Following the school review we will be preparing our next Business Plan. Parents can help with our next three year plan by providing us with feedback through the bi annual parent survey that will be available soon. At any time of course we welcome your ideas and feedback.

Thirty-eight students from North Albany Senior High School embarked on a full tour of Canberra recently. The students started their journey in Sydney by experiencing first-hand the iconic structures of the Sydney Harbour Bridge and the Opera House, along with visits to the world renowned Bondi beach and the Taronga Park Zoo.

Whilst in Canberra the students were afforded the opportunity to witness question time in both Houses of Parliament; they met with local MP Rick Wilson and Western Australian Senator Jordon Steele-John.

The students also sat in on a case being heard by all seven High Court judges and viewed both Saturn and Jupiter through telescopes in the ANU Research Institute on Mt Stromlo.

Our visit to the Australian War Memorial culminated in our school participating the wreath laying ceremony at the close of the day.

Other locations visited in Canberra included: Old Parliament House, Questacon, the National Gallery, the Australian Institute of Sport, the National Museum, the Australian Mint, CSIRO and the National Arboretum.

The excursion was supported by the Australian government through the Parliament and Civics Education Rebate (PACER) who assisted by providing a rebate of \$240.

VacSwim 2018


With swimming pools and beaches a big part of the Western Australian lifestyle, ensuring your children can swim competently and safely is essential.
